

ANNUAL REVIEW 2018

By far the most traumatic and inspiring event for us all began with *Miracles*'; Head of Mission in Bosnia, Matthew Procter OBE, suffering a stroke. He had been feeling unwell for some time and had eventually taken the advice of doctors in Mostar to return to the UK for treatment. He delayed plans for the trip due to the vital contract with the International Trust Fund to supply limbs for landmine victims alongside the psychotherapy so important to their wellbeing. However, still unwell, Matthew finally booked tickets to return home. Then, early one morning, just days before his flight, he was found on the floor of his apartment at the *Miracles* Centre having suffered a very severe stroke. The Centre Team got him into Mostar Hospital by ambulance where he remained in a coma for four days until it was clear that they had neither the skills nor the equipment to save his life.



His many friends in and around Medjugorje were praying constantly for his recovery although hope was fast running out and hospital bills were rising rapidly. Then The Arthur McClusky Foundation – a charity dedicated to help suffering people in Bosnia and well known supporters of the *Miracles*' Centre—came to his aid and arranged and funded an Air Ambulance to bring him to the UK.

At the James Cook Hospital in Middlesborough, the doctors were confronted with an end of life situation: a severe stroke, a broken shoulder and an unknown virus which was the main threat to his life.

Consultants, virologists and toxicologists were called in from London and an ultra strong drug was used as their final hope.

By now Masses were being held and prayers offered for Matt's survival all over the world. And the prayers were heard. Slowly and painfully Matthew began to respond to the drug and although traces of the virus are still in his body, within days his truly miraculous recovery began.



Matthew is now back in touch with his beloved work in BiH and with his wonderful team, Elvira Dugalic who manages the Centre, Nihad Subasic our Prosthetist, and Amel Mrkonjic who is to be appointed as Matthew's and *Miracles*' official Representative in BiH from lst January, 2019.

Amel was 'adopted' by Matthew early in the Bosnian war. He found him wandering the bombed streets with no one to look after him, frightened and hungry, Matt took him in to his own meagre apartment in East Mostar, along with several other street children he had rescued from the rubble of war. ..

Like other children in Matthew's care, Amel was educated by *Miracles* and is now a trainee Prosthetist and eager to perfect his English for his position as *Miracles*'Representative in BiH. A proud title to bear

Respite Breaks and Rapid Response Crisis Fund

The *Miracles*' Respite Break Caravans are available free of charge for ten months of the year—excluding January and February. Bookings for school holidays are always in demand but we welcome term-time and short weekend breaks. *Miracles* also deals with families in crisis throughout the UK and with individual cases needing Rapid Response with no delays or form filling.. Referrals of such cases are welcomed from CABs, Hospitals, Social Workers and *Miracles*' own voluntary Caseworkers. Requests from individuals are not considered unless endorsed by one of the above.

Occasional cash grants can be made to assist with food and essentials for families in dire circumstances with no recourse to public funds. Interim one-off grants may also be considered for Crisis Funding pending benefits being sought, debt control plans implemented or one-off payments to prevent disconnection of telephone/household services/eviction etc.

Many of the families referred to us for Respite Breaks come from CLIC-Sargent Social Workers in the major childrens' hospitals throughout the country. In recent months referrals are also greatly increasing for urgent crisis grants for parents of children with life threatening conditions. Grants range from travel costs to and from the various hospitals, to food, clothing and household essentials.

During the past year Miracles have provided Respite Breaks for 60 families in our two Caravans in Selsey and two further breaks in this country and in Northern Ireland. A total of 26 Crisis Funding requests were met throughout the year but sadly several had to be rejected due to limited funds

The following refers to a refugee family from Syria who Miracles was privileged to support:

In June 2017 we received a request through our website asking us to help a Syrian refugee family who had recently arrived in the UK with a very sick 5-year-old urgently needing Cancer treatment. We first discovered that the family had initially been housed in crowded and appallingly unhygienic conditions and the authorities were pressed into finding them an alternative. They were then moved several times and finally appropriate accommodation was found for them in Dagenham. However, they had virtually no furniture nor money for food, clothes or to pay for travel to see their son in hospital. We discovered that the child was in The Royal Marsden Hospital and we got in touch with the Clic-Sargent Social Worker assigned to his case. Through her we were able to find out more about them and their urgent needs. We then made a grant of £1,000 to Clic-Sargent at the hospital for the Social Worker to provide the essentials needed most. Subsequently we were put in direct touch with the parents but unfortunately they spoke no English and an interpreter had first to be found. They are a family of five, mother and father, their eldest son with a genetic eating disorder and the youngest, Jawed, very sick with Cancer. He is now slowly recovering but still in constant need of ongoing hospital treatment. This past year *Miracles* has provided money for food, clothes and travel, and items for their home including a television, computer, microwave, pots and pans and other essentials. This year, too, the whole family, along with their interpreter and his family, enjoyed a wonderful week at one of our caravans in Selsey, West Sussex. *Miracles*' help and support is ongoing—our latest gifts being bikes for the boys. miracles really have happened for them.

MIRACLES' Music in Prison Project

Behind Bars

The third *Miracles* music project, Behind Bars, came to an end in June 2018. The project was sponsored by Santander and Billy Bragg who donated six guitars through his charity Jail Guitar Doors.

It took place in Brixton Prison Drug Rehabilitation Wing with 10 prisoners finishing the 3-month program.. The course took place every Tuesday afternoon -teaching prisoners how to play the guitar and write their

own songs. The whole project culminated in a concert on the wing with prisoners playing their music in front of fellow prisoners and staff. The concert was recorded by the Prison Radio Authority and broadcast across their network of 60.000+ prisoners UK wide. The course, run by *Miracles* Project Director James Burton and his music partner Andrew Harwood (*pictured right* with the guitars donated to the project by Billy Bragg) is designed to compliment the prison's own Rehabilitation Program. Writing, playing and performing music is a very cathartic process and helps prisoners explore their motivations and emotions in a constructive and positive environment. The objective is to contribute to their long term rehabilitation back into society. On the back of this success *Miracles* has just won another grant from the Big Lottery to enable us to put on two more projects in London prisons during 2019.

Christmas is a particularly tough time to be in prison and very challenging for prisoners trying to live drug free. Events and activities like the concert help to give prisoners struggling with addiction the strength to carry on. Knowing there are people on the outside who want to help them with their long term rehabilitation is a great source of comfort especially over Christmas.

MIRACLES' Centre for Prosthesis and Care in BIH

In August this year Divita *Miracles* took on a new project in conjunction with the University Rehabilitation Institute of Slovenia and with the support of the German Embassy and the International Trust Fund in Slovenia.





The goal of the project is to provide free prosthetic care coupled with psychotherapy for an initial 38 Land Mine Victims to reduce the number of LMVs in BiH who do not have adequate access to prosthetic care.

The Miracles' Disney Princesses











Regardless, along with 70 others taking on the challenge we were up early and hit the road, which is when the vision started to become a reality. We enjoyed three days of perfect sunshine (and remarkably considerate French drivers) as we carved our way through France on the way to Paris.

We made it there in the end, rode round the Champs de Elysee and came to a halt under the Eiffel Tower for a celebratory (plastic) cup of champagne and cheesy photos (below) after our 300 mile journey.

We were delighted to be able to take on the challenge for Miracles and between the three of us managed to raise over £5,000. It's safe to say we'd all recommend taking on the challenge. It was a great trip.'
